
We wish to offer an enriching educational experience tailored for a globalized world. Supported by critical thinking and the continuous generation of knowledge through research.

Universidad Andrés Bello is the controller of Post University, a university founded in 1890 in Connecticut, United States.

With more than 20 thousand students and 58 undergraduate and graduate programs, Post University has been consecutively accredited for more than 50 years and has been a pioneer in the use of online training methodologies.

It is the first Chilean university to acquire a university in the United States, thereby internationalizing its educational model, which considers academic excellence, the generation of new knowledge, and the promotion of diversity and sustainability as its pillars.

The purpose of this collaboration agreement is to promote the exchange, production and dissemination of research focused on the most relevant economic policy issues for Latin America.




